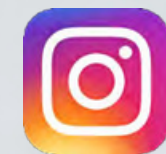

EXCLUSIVE: Prime Video’s hit series *Jury Duty* is returning for a second season on March 20, and Deadline has your first look at the 14 new ensemble cast members.

Jury Duty Presents: Company Retreat will feature Alex Bonifer (*Kevin Can F**k Himself*), Blair Beeken (*Pluribus*), Emily Pendergast (*Veep*), Erica Hernandez (*True Lies*), Jerry Hauck (*Paradise*), Jim A. Woods (*The Office*), LaNisa Renee Frederick (*Shifting Gears*), Marc-Sully Saint-Fleur (*Home Economics*), Rachel Kaly (*Worried*), Rob Lathan (*Inside Amy Schumer*), Ryan Perez (*The Break with Michelle Wolf*), Stephanie Hodge (*The Comeback*), Warren Burke (*Dead for a Dollar*), and **Wendy Braun** (*Atypical*).

Season 2 will premiere with three episodes, followed by two episodes on March 27, and a three-episode finale on April 3.

Jake Szymanski directs and executive produces the series. David Bernad also executive produces with Todd Schulman, Nicholas Hatton, Anthony King, Chris Kula, James Marsden and Ruben Fleischer.

Meet the New Cast Members of *Jury Duty* Season 2, *Company Retreat* (Exclusive)

All the actors pretend to work for a hot sauce company and prank one unsuspecting temp worker

Jury Duty is back with a new unsuspecting lead and a fresh cast of characters trying their best to keep the truth under wraps: that the star is really in the middle of an elaborate prank.

PEOPLE can exclusively reveal the eclectic cast of characters featured in Prime Video's Jury Duty Presents: Company Retreat, the next installment from the team behind Jury Duty, the hit documentary-style comedy that was released in 2023.

Company Retreat follows a temp worker named Anthony as he heads to "a corporate offsite event at a family-owned hot sauce company," per a synopsis, Anthony has no idea that everything around him has been staged — and he's the only one not in on the joke.

"The beginning of the writing process is actor-blind," Hatton shares of casting. "Once we have a general sense of a character's fundamental engine, the casting process is very open and Susie Farris (our brilliant Casting Director) watches thousands of tapes to leave no stone unturned. We then whittle folks down with an unusual callback process that emulates the unique environment that the actors will ultimately be performing in."

He continues, "There are performers that we love and encourage to submit from the outset but at the end of the day because it's such an unorthodox gig that stretches so many different parts of a performer's skill and mindset, everyone has to go through the same process so that we all feel confident they'll be able to pull it off."

The below cast is full of actors that Anthony could have easily encountered before, maybe on TV or in passing. But the "screening techniques" from the Jury Duty team gave them "a fair degree of confidence that Anthony wouldn't recognize anyone," Hatton says.

"It's still not a guarantee, especially when you're casting 12 series regulars plus a bevy of day players. The most tense period is the beginning before Anthony went on the retreat; that first night he stayed at a hotel and a number of our cast were in some pretty big commercials airing at the time. But once we got to Oak Canyon — which had no access to live TV — we knew we were in the clear," he adds of the retreat location.

‘Jury Duty’ Renewed at Amazon, Season 2 Already Filmed

The next installment of 2023's hit candid camera show will reportedly take place at a corporate retreat.

Jury Duty will return for — and has already filmed — a second season at Amazon Prime Video, The Hollywood Reporter confirmed Thursday.

Sources report Jury Duty's second season will leave the witness stand behind in favor of a corporate retreat setting. It was shot in the Agoura Hills suburb of Los Angeles.



Season one showrunner Cody Heller previously told THR she was “terrified” by the challenge of pulling off the candid camera feat. “There was something about that fear of failure that ignited something in myself,” she said. But in the end, the success came from the cast. “Ronald Gladden restored my faith in humanity,” she said.

Marsden echoed Heller's description of high stakes when describing his own experience on set. “This is unlike anything you've ever seen before,” he told THR. “You get one take. If he sees a hidden camera, or someone calls somebody by the wrong name, the whole thing is upended. That was really exciting to me, just from the perspective of [wondering], ‘Can we pull this off?’”

Gladden eventually embraced the candid camera reveal, and went on to sign with Gersh, and ink his own deal with Amazon, which sees him develop and star in a variety of content. He and Marsden, along with several other of the show's actors, remain friends. “

Jury Duty was created by Lee Eisenberg and Gene Stupnitsky, who also executive produced season one with Heller, David Bernad, Todd Schulman, Ruben Fleischer, Nicholas Hatton, Andrew Weinberg and director Jake Szymanski.

‘Jury Duty’ To Return For Season 2 On Amazon; Theme Of New Installment Revealed

One of the comedy breakouts of 2023 was Jury Duty, a documentary-style comedy for Amazon Freevee that featured James Marsden and other actors surrounding an unsuspecting juror at a trial. The Emmy-nominated comedy is back and — surprise — its second season is already in the can, sources tell Deadline. It will run on Prime Video where Freevee's content migrated after Amazon's free ad-supported streaming platform was shut down last November.

Details are being kept under wraps but we hear that the theme of the new installment is David vs. Goliath. Taking inspiration from classic 1980s movies such as Animal House and Caddyshack, it is about a small business going on a company retreat, with the real, unsuspecting person tested when a Goliath suddenly shows up, sources said.

To protect the integrity of the premise with the regular person not realizing that they are part of a scripted TV show, just like they did with Season 1, the casting and production of the new installment was done in a clandestine manner.

The majority of the series' creative team is believed to be back. Season 1 was executive produced by David Bernad, Lee Eisenberg, Ruben Fleischer, Nicholas Hatton, Cody Heller, Todd Schulman, Gene Stupnitsky, Jake Szymanski and Andrew Weinberg. Eisenberg and Stupnitsky co-created the series, Heller served as showrunner, and Szymanski directed.

The first season earned four Emmy nominations in 2023, including Outstanding Comedy Series, Supporting Actor In a Comedy Series for Marsden, Writing For a Comedy Series and Casting for a Comedy Series.



Not Only Is This Actress On ‘Atypical,’ She Creates Game Changing Courses Helping Thousands Of Creatives

When ringing phones were attached permanently to the wall, most people would walk, even run over, to answer them. But **Wendy Braun**’s mother always delighted in sharing how her young daughter, in full performance mode, would dance across the kitchen to answer. “For as long as I can remember my passion for performing has been part of who I am,” says Braun who is in her 4th season playing Kathy on the Netflix hit comedy, *Atypical*.

Over and over, performing nurtured Braun, providing what she needed. At 13 when she was 5’10” and feeling like a fish out of water, she was cast as The Scarecrow in The Wiz. She was able to parlay her gangly awkwardness to bring the character to life and entertain. “It was magical,” she recalls. “I didn’t realize it then but performing at that age saved my soul and made me feel at home at a time when I definitely felt like an outsider.”

In 1994 she moved from Chicago to Los Angeles to pursue acting. Initially she worked mostly as a dancer. She booked a job performing for three months in Monte Carlo opening for headliners Stevie Wonder, Barry White, Natalie Cole and Earth Wind & Fire. On the plane ride home she wrote in her journal that she was going to focus all of her energy on acting. She would only return to the South of France if she was in film at the Cannes Film Festival. Three years later she was cast as the lead in a feature film. And it premiered in Cannes.

“I learned how powerful it can be to state and clarify your vision,” shares Braun, an accomplished actress whose many credits also includes *Grey’s Anatomy*, *It’s Always Sunny In Philadelphia* and *Criminal Minds*. **“Even if you don’t know *how* it will unfold.”**

One force that kept her going was her late father’s guidance. “My father was my biggest cheerleader,” says Braun of the man who would pass away when she was 27. The last words he left on her answering machine were “keep going sunshine.”

In 2015 Braun founded [ActorInspiration.com](#). “I wanted to make a lasting impact on the lives of other people and authentically share all the tools and processes that helped me achieve success while also finding more fun, joy and fulfillment along the way,” she says of her program that empowers creatives to overcome obstacles and discover success on their own terms.

A few weeks ago, when a friend told me, “Right now, meditation feels like worrying with my eyes closed,” I knew I wanted to help people take the guesswork (and worry) out of meditation and find some peace amidst all of the panic.

I’m fortunate to have a home recording studio, where I do voice-over jobs and have been creating guided meditations for actors for years, helping them thrive in all kinds of uncertainty. But now, I want to make sure anyone who needs help easing anxiety and improving well-being can access some relief, for free.

It felt so good to put the focus on how I could help others to create a sense of calm within the chaos, and in writing and recording the guided audio meditation, it helped me to do the same.

The Dalai Lama states that, “World peace begins with inner peace.” And yet, so many of us don’t know how to find that inner peace, even in our regular busy lives, much less in the midst of a tumultuous global pandemic. But here we are, being asked to take a global pause, to sit with ourselves, and our thoughts and our feelings about it all. I know how overwhelming that can be for so many people.

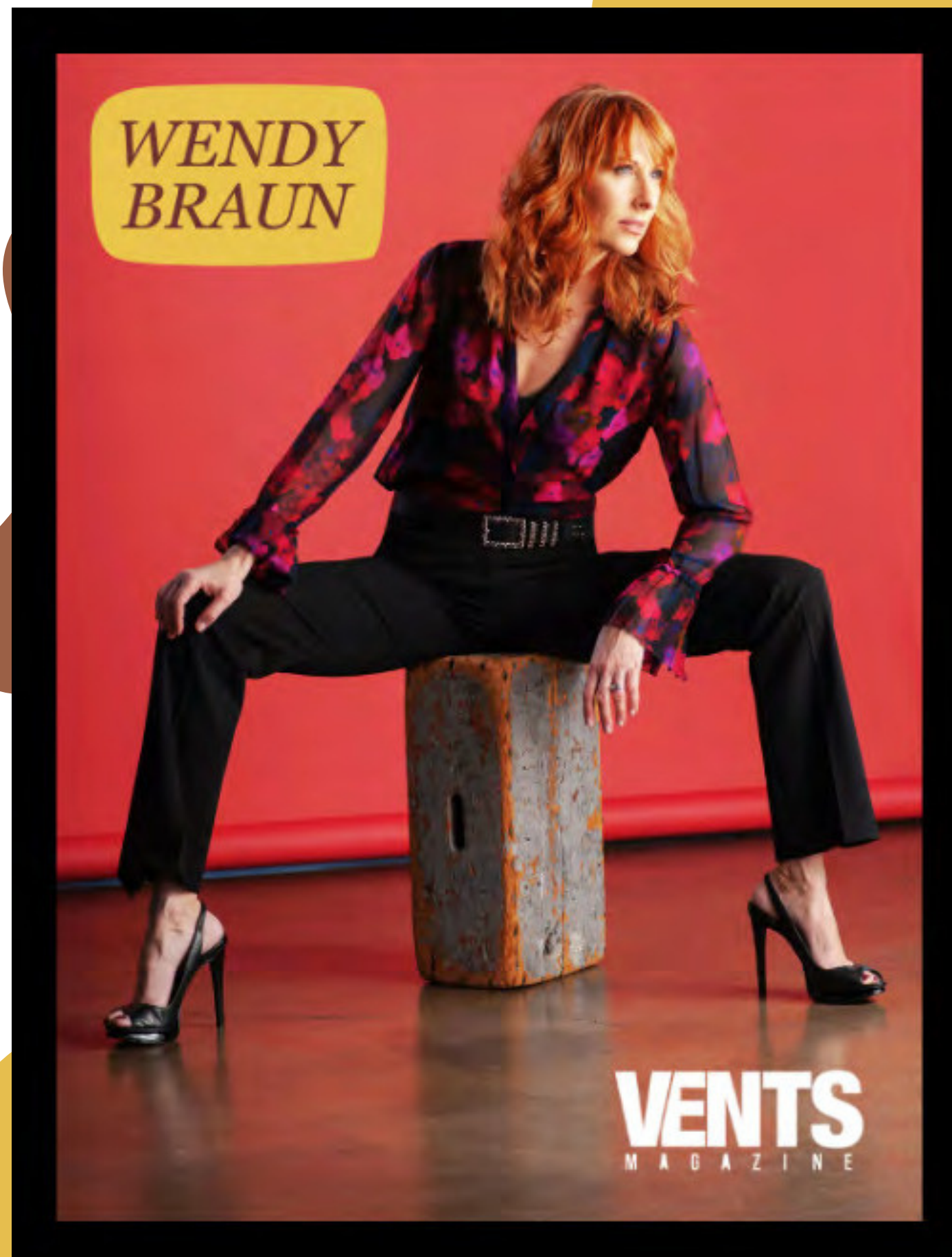
What has been comforting is knowing that every effort to serve others (no matter how big or small) has a positive ripple effect.

For years, I’ve been teaching an online course to actors worldwide, and I just learned that one of my students is also a nurse working in ICU treating COVID-19 patients. To hear that this 15-minute audio is helping her stay grounded in such a stressful environment means everything.

And just when I’m feeling overwhelmed with homeschooling my two boys or frustrated with the pile of dirty dishes in the sink, I get an email from an actress telling me, “I listened to your guided meditation and I felt better than I had in weeks.”

So ultimately, what has helped me the most is uplifting others and shining some light in all of the darkness. Oh yeah, and lots of snuggles and walks with our rescue dog, Daisy.

What excites you the most when you start a new project?

Inspirational Women In Hollywood: How Actress Wendy Braun Is Helping To Shake Up The Entertainment Industry

When you are loving yourself for existing, then you can start to love others that exist differently than you.



I had the pleasure of interviewing **Wendy Braun**. Actress Wendy Braun has been turning in scene-stealing performances for years. Currently, she returns for the final season of the acclaimed Netflix series, *Atypical*, as the supportive friend 'Kathy'. She hit the screen earlier this year as an ultimate uptight mother in the 80's period comedy film, *Donny's Bar Mitzvah*. Wendy has appeared in over 80 film and television projects, including *The Clapper* with Ed Helms and Tracy Morgan, *Grey's Anatomy*, *It's Always Sunny in Philadelphia*, *The Mentalist*, *Bones*, *Criminal Minds*, *iCarly*, and *Castle* among others. When she's not on set, Wendy helps her artistic community as a Transformation and Well-Being Expert as the founder of *ActorInspiration.com*.

Thank you so much for joining us in this interview series! Can you tell us the story of how you grew up? WENDY: I grew up in the northern suburbs of Chicago, where all the John Hughes movies were filmed. My mother was known as Miss Beverly, The Romper Room Lady, the host of the classic children's television show *Romper Room* and my father was a Navy pilot.

I always loved performing. My mom used to say that when the phone would ring (back when it was on the wall), I wouldn't walk, but I'd dance across the room to answer it. Thankfully, my parents encouraged my love of the arts, and it's been a part of who I am for as long as I can remember.

Can you tell us the most interesting story that happened to you since you began your career?

When I first moved to Los Angeles, I faced tons of rejection. The top 10 commercial agents all turned me down. They told me I was too tall, too theatrical, not commercial enough, that they had too many young women on their roster, that I didn't have enough experience, or my personal favorite, that they "already had someone exactly like me."

I drove home crying in my car after many of those meetings. In fact, I like to tell actors that if you haven't cried on at least 4 different freeways in Los Angeles, you just haven't lived here long enough.

And then, my biggest cheerleader + source of emotional support, my father, passed away. The last message he left on my answering machine was this...*"Keep going, Sunshine."* So that's what I did.

Through all of that rejection, even though everyone was telling me "no," I sought out ways to master my mindset and tell myself "yes" and just keep going.

Hi Wendy, what is the most important factor behind your success?

I think my success as an actress has definitely come from mastering the fine art of dealing with rejection, frustration + failure. The more I was told "no," the more I found ways to tell myself "yes," and to just keep going. As the owner and the founder of ActorInspiration.com, I think what has helped me to succeed is the combination of my years of experience in this industry along with my passion for inspiring others, as well as my willingness to be vulnerable while also remaining eternally open to my own personal growth. Speaking all over the world has made me realize that our challenges as creative artists are quite universal

Can you open up a bit about your work and career? We're big fans and we'd love for our community to learn more about your work.

I've been working as an actress in Hollywood for over 2 decades. Most recently, I'm back recurring for my 3rd season on Netflix's comedy series, "Atypical", as Kathy, (the uptight but well-intentioned autism parent support group leader and a friend of Jennifer Jason Leigh's). Up next, I'm starring in a soon-to-be released comedy feature film with Danny Trejo. I also do a lot of voice-over work in commercials and animation. What also lights me up has been sharing all I've learned along the way to help uplift and inspire other creative warriors. As the CEO and founder of ActorInspiration.com, I provide simple strategies + empowering tools that have now helped thousands of creatives overcome obstacles + create breakthrough success, all while living a more joy-filled life. It's been so fulfilling to not only achieve my own dreams, but to also help artists all over the globe to achieve theirs. I'm very thankful for all of it.

Who else deserves some credit and recognition?

I've had so many amazing mentors along the way, starting with my own late parents who encouraged me to "do what you love and the money will follow." I'm so grateful I listened to that advice and followed my heart, even when there were naysayers along the way. It's funny looking back, because those who doubted me also simultaneously lit a fire within me to keep going. In fact, one of the last messages my late father left on my answering machine when I had just moved to LA was, "Keep going, sunshine," and even though that was over 20 years ago, it has stayed with me all these years and has helped me to become the creative warrior I am today. My best advice: Ignore the critics, follow your heart and keep going. I'd also like to give a shoutout to my amazing husband, Josh Cox, who supports my every dream, and helps me to balance career and family (including our two exuberantly active young boys) with humor, love and joy.

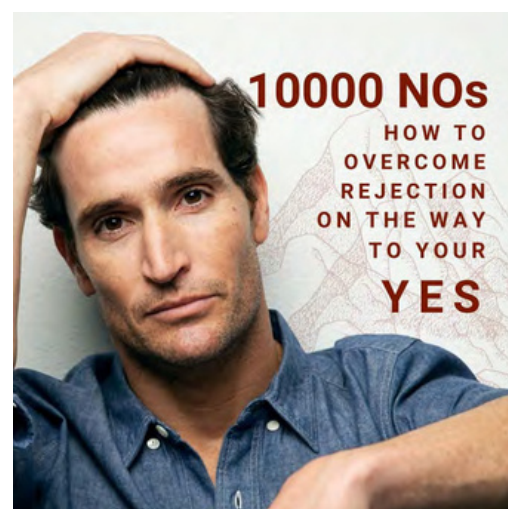
